Thank you all for your prayers and support! On March 7, I was approved for ordination in the North American Lutheran Church. I know plenty of folks heard Pastor Tim

make an announcement about this a couple weeks ago, and since then I know this has raised some questions. So I wanted to try to answer a couple of them.

- 1. "So, are you leaving?" or "What's your timeline?"—My placement here for internship was for one year, and that year is up at the end of August. I absolutely love being here and I am truly enjoying being at St Paul, but at the end of August I will need to move on. Right now there are no plans for me to leave earlier (or later) than that, and this is where I want to be until then. I got to talk with some of the folks on candidacy and I know that St Paul is still a part of the internship program and they will probably try to keep sending interns here for their Vicarage in the future. I don't know if someone is coming when I leave, but if I don't leave, there wouldn't be a place for them.
- 2. "Are you a Pastor now?"—Nope. For us, as Lutherans, someone like me who is a 'candidate for ordination' cannot be ordained as a pastor until they receive an official Call to a parish. What this means is that now that I'm approved for ordination, my next step is receiving a call. For this to happen, I have forms and paperwork that I will fill out (with 15 or so essay type questions) and I will give those to the Assistant to the Bishop of the NALC. He will give those forms to congregations looking to Call a Pastor and then, hopefully, there will be a parish that wants to interview me and eventually call me. If I receive a Call to a parish, then I will be able to be ordained before I would begin a Call there.

I know there may be other questions, but these are the most common when it comes to where I am in the internship process. I do not know what the future holds, but I do know that this parish has a distinct role in shaping me for the future of my ministry—and I know that there wouldn't be a future without you. Thank you! - **Treasurer** John reported a \$10,000 donation was from Wm Speary designated for the addition to the elevator parking lot.
- Stewardship John reported the committee would be working on reclassification of assets...
- Youth The Task Force for Youth Director met on Feb. 12 & Feb 26 to review job descriptions from other churches. They will meet again on March 26 to compile a Job Description for a Youth Director for St. Paul. The confirmation class will stuff plastic eggs and participate in the annual Egg Hunt on Apr. 15.

- **Worship** After acolyte training 5 new students were added to the rotation.
- **Social Concerns** Judy reported one person was helped with a gift card, the YAM building will be completed in the next 60 days and there will be a blood drive on May 21, 2017.
- Property Wayne said he is to be notified about any building maintenance problems and the big projects are being handled by committees.
- Parish Ed A Community VBS meeting was held on Feb. 26th at which time it was decided the theme for this year's VBS will be "Mighty Fortress" The date is set for June 26 30. Nursery aged children will attend from 9 a.m. o 11:30 a.m. and K 5th grade will be from 9 a.m. noon. The committee will meet again on April 23 at 4:30 p.m. Volunteers may contact Tina Boehm. The Sunday School Teachers will meet in March to discuss plans for the Easter Egg Hunt, Summer Sunday School and curriculum options for the Fall.
- **C.E.M.** Total enrollment is 62 with 15 of those being subsidized by the government.
- Christian Life Shrove Tuesday sausage & pancake supper served 60 people. Linda invited everyone to come to the Pot Luck meal to be held March 19th. The Christian Life committee will be coordinating the soup and sandwiches for the Lenten Wednesday night meal.
- **Cemetery** The meeting between the two parties concerning a tree at the cemetery will be held March 10 at 3 p.m.

- Vicar Hans During February professional activities included 8 worship services, 1 pastoral visits, 4 educational events, 1 church meeting. Official acts included, 1 funeral, and 1 baptism. Especially noted was that Vicar Hans has been approved for ordination.
- Pastor Tim reported that during February professional activities included 9 Worship services, 2 hospital visits, 9 home visits, 10 educational events, 5 church meetings & events, & 1 Professional Meeting. Official Acts included 2/19 Baptism of Keilani Lynne Winpigler, and 2/21 burial of Shirley Schultz.
- OLD BUSINESS a) Update on Fellowship Hall covered entrance – one bid from Augustin Reza for \$35,515 was received and a bid from Don Krueger is pending. **b)** Elevator parking lot - The Task Force created as a result of the Annual Meeting in Jan. found it unnecessary to accept the plan as presented to the Congregation meeting. The Task Force recommended paving at least the spaces on the east side adjacent to the existing parking lot and converting the parking spaces near the elevator facing the street into handicapped spaces. Two bids have been received for this work (Garcia Masonry at \$12,053 and Schumacher Concrete at \$11,900. The lot would be 22ft x 93ft x 5". A discussion was held concerning street parking within the church's property. A motion was made, seconded and approved to table the decision about the bids for the parking lot. c) Update on installation of hand rails - A motion was made, seconded and carried to table the action on installation of hand rails pending walking the church grounds and making a list of handrails needed by all steps and ramps on the church property. **d**) Status of controversial cemetery plots – a meeting of the 2 parties along with Bill Klaevemann, Pastor Tim, Jay & Sandra Heil will be held March 10th.
- NEW BUSINESS a) The April council meeting will be held on April 20th at 6:30 p.m. b) Wednesday nights Lent offering will go to YAM. c) A motion was made, seconded and approved to give \$1,000 per scholarship to this year's St. Paul seniors that apply. d) The Electric Service Provider contract expires in May, Wayne will compare the price per kilowatt and all additional fees to bring to the next council meeting.

• With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.



Words of Wellness for April 2017 From the Wesley Nurse

Letting Go, Letting Come

As Easter approaches I am reminded of a story of a young girl who received sunflower seeds to plant in her backyard. Her parents advised her as to when it was the right time to plant the seeds in the ground, and she happily did so, burying them several inches into the soil. Her parents also explained to her that it would take seven to ten days before the new plants would sprout.



Each day the girl watered the plants as she had been instructed to do. Then, when no one was looking, she would get out her small shovel out and

dig up each seed, lifting it out of the ground to see if it was, in fact, sprouting. Several weeks passed and the parents wondered why none of the sunflower seeds were sprouting. The girl, overhearing her parents, reported that she had wondered the same, and went on to say that this was why she had been digging them up every day, to inspect them for signs of growth. So the mystery for the parents was solved, and the daughter learned an important lesson. It takes great patience to wait for new life to sprout, and any attempts to rush the process may in fact prevent it from happening altogether.

Easter is, of course, the ultimate story of new life. The celebration of Easter is the celebration of Jesus' resurrection and the belief that God continues to sprout new life in our midst. In our Living Compass Lenten booklet this year the meditations focused on the practice of letting go. In line with the lesson learned by the girl who was learning to grow sunflower plants, we are reminded that the sprouting of new life requires us to be patient, and that we are wise to learn to practice both letting go and letting come.

New life takes time to form and sprout. We cannot rush the process by trying impatiently to force change or growth to happen. Growth happens at its own rate. The caterpillar will emerge as a butterfly in its own time frame, not ours. The adolescent will become an adult in his or her own time frame, not ours. The pain of

grief will gradually subside and a new normal will emerge, but only in its own time. The time it takes to grow wise in one's later years cannot be forced either, it can only be accomplished over a long period of time and then embraced.

Resurrection, and all new life, is a gift that happens around us

every day. In order to fully receive this gift of new life, we need to simply, but not easily, wait patiently for life to sprout, in its own way, and in its own time-keeping our eyes open for the miracles of new life that are happening around us all the time.
