November 12, 2019

Kimberly gave the devotion.

MINUTES With no additions or corrections, the minutes of October 8, 2019 were approved as printed.

REPORTS

A. TREASURER Calvin reported the balance in the General Fund was \$191,450.46 as of October 31, 2019, while the balance in the Building Fund was \$6,477.19. Calvin made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report. After a second by Ray, the motion carried.

B. STEWARDSHIP A discussion of the distribution of the Annual BBQ funds will be held during New Business.

C. YOUTH No report

D. WORSHIP Pastor Suggs will lead two Church services in January. Pastor Ron Walters will lead the worship services on November 23rd and 24th. - Jay

E. SOCIAL CONCERNS Two households were helped in October and 52 people received flu shots at the flu clinic held at St. Paul Lutheran. - Judy

F. PROPERTY Lower limbs of trees will be trimmed at the cemetery, grass was mowed at the cemetery, working with the city concerning the utility bills, AT&T is working to repair telephone lines that went down on Nau Street due high winds toppling a tree and the Church was home for several hours for the evacuees from the blow out on an oil well near Cotton Patch. - Ray

G. PARISH EDUCATION The Nursery, Elementary, and Jr. High's lessons are from the Spark Bible. The committee helped with games at the fall Festival, at which about 20 children participated in the dessert walk, corn hole and ring toss games. All roles for the Christmas pageant have been filled. Erin and Laurie will be helping Kim direct this year. Linda will work with the costumes and will donate the bags given to children after the Christmas Service. -Kimberly

H. C.E.M. No report

I. EVANGELISM An ad was placed in the Yorktown Newspaper for Pastor Appreciation 2019.

Preparations are underway for New Member Weekend on December 15^{th} . – Martha

J. CHRISTIAN LIFE The Fall Feast on 10-27-19 was well attended by approximately 140 people. Pastor Tim's 10th anniversary with St. Paul and his 60th birthday along with Nicholas' 30th birthday were celebrated with cake and gifts. Games for the children were also

enjoyed. The quilt brought in \$2000 for the projects supported by the women of the church. Christian Life is currently helping with the Community Thanksgiving meal to be held on 11-17-19 at Gruenau Hall. Christian Life is also preparing for the catered Christmas meal for 12-08-19. - Cathy

K. CEMETERY Six lots in the old section have been sold, with 4 lots remaining. The burial of Victor Henneke, from Woodsboro, will be held on November 15^{th} .

L. NICHOLAS Inside the Church, Nick is teaching students to pray for others in person, helping Pastor Tim with the Confirmation Class, and helping with the Christmas Service and Program. Outside the Church, Nick attended 2 volleyball games and took 20 people to the Circle N Maze.

The future events include the Christmas Service, setting up the Manger Scene, the Christmas Program, and having students fill the bags to be given out after the Christmas Program. \$95.40 was spent during the month of October.

M. PASTOR Professional activities during October included 9 Worship services, 5 Hospital visits, 6 Home visits, 14 educational events, 15 Church meetings and events, 1 Professional meeting, 1 Community Event, and attendance at Texas NALC Clergy Retreat October 28-29th in Belton. Official Acts included Committal Service for Myrlin Wagner, Burial of Jimmy Voelkel, and Burial of Annie Domann. Pastor Tim also expressed his thanks for the gifts he received for his birthday, the 10th anniversary with St. Paul's Lutheran Church, and Pastor Appreciation.

OLD BUSINESS

A. NOMNATING COMMITTEE REPORT So far the committee has not had a meeting.

B. BUDGET 2020 All budgets should be turned in to Calvin by the December meeting.

C. ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH WELCOME SIGNS

The old signs were made of wood and must be replaced because of fading and weather damage. Sign Works of Victoria has given a bid of \$1,950, for 5 metal signs that will have a white background with burgundy letters. A donation has been received for these signs. Metal should last longer than the original wood signs.

NEW BUSINESS

A. APPROVAL OF NEW MEMBERS Dorothy made a motion to approve Jeremy and Lori Kneese and Children, Gwen, Hannah, and Owen as new members. Jay seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried. New Members will be welcomed on Saturday, December 7th and Sunday, December 15th with a celebration on December 15th. During Sunday's New Member ceremony, two children from the Medina family will be Confirmed.

B. APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF CALVIN BRUNS AS AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATVE FOR WEISCHWILL ACCOUNT WITH EDWARD JONES.

Dorothy Mayfield made a motion on 11/12/2019 to approve the following resolution having Calvin Bruns as an authorized representative of St. Paul Lutheran Church which was organized on August 21, 1876: "Resolved, that the individuals identified shall have the full power and authority on behalf of the corporation to enter an agreement on behalf of the corporation; open a brokerage account on the behalf of the corporation; do and perform every act to be done in conjunction with the account being opened, including, but not limited to, being able to transfer, endorse, sell, assign, and deliver any and all certificates of stock, bonds, debentures, notes, subscriptions, warrants, stock purchase warrants, evidences of indebtedness, or other securities now and hereafter registered in the name of or owned by the corporation, and make, execute, and deliver any and all written instruments necessary to effectuate the authority hereby granted." Kimberly seconded the motion. The motion carried.

C. APPROVE AUTHORIZED SIGNERS ON WEISCHWILL ACCOUNT. Judy made a motion to approve Catherine Serrano, Pam Weise, Dorothy Mayfield, Bill Klaevemann, John Frels, and Calvin Bruns as authorized signers on the Weischwill account with Edward Jones. Kimberly seconded the motion. The motion carried.

D. BID FOR AUTOMATIC DOOR The entrance door to the Education building is very difficult for anyone in a wheelchair, or walker to manage. It is also difficult for a delivery person or small children to open. To address those problems, a company, Door Control Services (DCS) from Corpus Christi was contacted. Two types of door were suggested:

Horton Automatics installed for \$2,677.

Record USA installed for \$2,458 DCS recommended Horton Automatics because the motor was a little heavier making it a better fit for the heavy door at the entrance. The cost does not include an electric connection that an electrician would need to install. The door would be opened by a button on a pole outside and on the wall inside. This company services the automatic doors in hospitals in Victoria. Judy made a motion to have the Horton Automatics door opener installed for \$2,677. Ray seconded the motion. The motion unanimously carried.

E. Discuss Terrorism Risk Insurance Because of the large amount of destruction necessary to occur before such an addition to a policy could be filed for restitution, Ray made a motion to reject that option provided with our current insurance company, Church Mutual. After a second by Cathy, the motion carried.

F. SILENT AUCTION CONCERNS Concerns about the auctioning of donated items, were discussed.

G. ANNUAL COMMITTEE REPORTS All committees should have their reports turned in by January 6th.

H. ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING Jay made a motion to have the Annual Congregational Meeting on January 26th, 2020. Dorothy seconded the motion. The motion carried. Sunday school will be dismissed that Sunday so teachers will be able to attend the meeting that is held right after the 9 AM worship service.

I. REVIEW ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL AGENDA

Suggested items for the Annual congregational meeting were discussed.

J. DISTRIBUTION OF ANNUAL BARBEQUE PROCEEDS

Kim made a motion to divide the proceeds from the annual babeque equally between Yorktown Volunteer Fire Department, Yorktown Assistance Ministries, Yorktown EMS, Keep Yorktown Beautiful, and the Learning Garden. Ray seconded the motion. The motion carried.

K. DECEMBR 10TH MEETING Ray made a motion to change the date of the Tuesday, December 10th meeting to Wednesday, December 11, 2019. After a second by Dorothy, the motion carried.
L. STOVE REQUEST Complaints about the commercial cooking range in the kitchen not cooking properly, being dangerous to light, and being 15 to 20 years old have been received from the people

that work in the kitchen on different occasions. Ray said he would get a technician out to get estimates on repair or replacement. **CLOSING** Jay made a motion to adjourn, Ray seconded the motion. The motion carried. The meeting was closed with *THE LORD'S PRAYER*




