It is right to associate Easter with death and graveyards. Christ has conquered death! The empty tomb is God's dramatic message to us that we face not a hopeless end, but an endless hope! Indeed, there is life after death. The resurrection of Christ is our own guarantee of that! "Because He lives, we too will live." And so we celebrate that ultimate victory of life over death that Jesus has won for us. Easter this year is April 20th and we continue in the Easter Season until the Day of Pentecost on June 8th. On April 27th we have our Cemetery Decoration Day Service at the cemetery reminding us, that even though we are surrounded by death, we have the reassurance of new life in Jesus Christ.

But Easter is not only a proclamation that there is life after death; it is a proclamation that there is life during life! Paul says in Philippians 3:10, "I want to know Jesus, and the power of His resurrection." He also writes to the Ephesians and reminds them that the power that is available for them is nothing less than the power God used to raise Jesus from the dead! (Ephesians 1:19-20) Death is something more than dying. Death can rob life of meaning, purpose, and power. Guilt and sin causes people to be "dead" before they die. Resurrection is the gift of God that assures us that there is power over death in life, today, in our personal lives. In Romans 8, where Paul lists the things that cannot separate us from the love of Christ, he lists both death and life! Isn't that something? Yes, even life can separate us from the love of Christ if we are not living in a trust relationship to Jesus, the source of life.

This too is Easter! The proclamation that there is life during life! That the power of the resurrection is actually available for

daily life. That we can walk in life, we can live in the power of life! Jesus, victorious even over death, promises to go before us, to be with us, to bless our todays with life and to secure our tomorrows with life! This is the fullness of the Easter message.

A Calling to Make a Difference...

Mrs. Margie Smothers, Mrs. Arthur Deninger, Mr. and Mrs. Terry Park. They may not be familiar to you but to me and the other 16 children that began their faith journey they have a place in our hearts and minds. Several of them may never know what an impact they had on this group. One thing is for sure though, without them all of us would have never known and experienced the gift of faith in our lives given us at Trinity Lutheran Church in San Antonio. They are no longer with us but they are in our hearts. They answered the call to share God's word with us in Sunday School from youngsters and as we grew into our teen years. We came to know God's love for us, His Son's sacrifice and grace for us, and the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives through their efforts.

We have a great set of teachers but as time moves on, and children and families grow and become more involved, just like us, time gets shorter and more demanding. That is why we would like to ask you to see if you are hearing the call to share God with our youngsters as a Sunday School Teacher. You may be saying "but you already have teachers." Well, we do but wouldn't it be better if we had more? The children will see that learning about God is important to many people and not just one person who is there to teach. It gives a new teacher a chance to see and assist and not have to step right in. It allows all teachers to fulfill this responsibility and the flexibility to share it when times conflict and one must miss a Sunday or two. And, finally, it makes for a smooth transition when one does have to leave teaching for a while.

However, the most important reason is the call to share God's love and story to the children. Sunday School and Bible study is the backbone of the church. As we get older it becomes harder to stand because the back is growing weaker. This goes for churches as well...when the backbone struggles the body gets a little weaker.

The children are definitely the church now, but don't we want them to be the church of the future? In Baptism we as a church say..."we welcome you into the Lord's family..." Do we not want the best for our family? Are we correct when we want them to see that faith lasts throughout their life and not just through Elementary School? Do we not want them to see faith in action and that the church wants them to be here? What does it say to them if they hear we don't have any teachers for their class?

Are you the next Mrs. Smothers, Mrs. Deninger or Mr. and Mrs. Park? Can God use you to make a difference in a child's life? I think each of these people above, will tell you they didn't think they could do it. But to this day, because of their faith in God's help and call, there are 17 of us who not only remember God's stories but their being there for us in those classrooms.

We can provide you with all you need. The curriculum is provided to you and you will have help. All we need is you and your willing heart to help and be there!



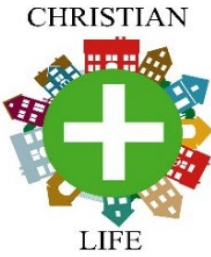

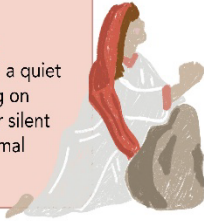
Speaking in Parables

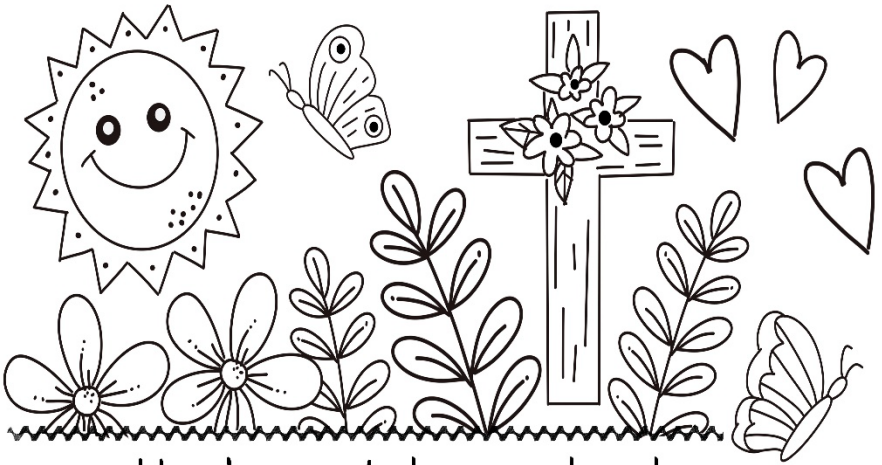
