Ask the many unchurched Americans who once were active Christians at what time they lost their Christian faith, and chances are they will be surprised to hear that they ever lost it, perhaps are even offended that you asked the question. The fact is, many of them lost whatever Christian faith they had through the gradual and unnoticeable process of a slow leak. It might have been better if they had lost it by a blowout -- then they would at least have known it. They would have had a warning to wake up before things got too bad.

Many people who do not attend church regularly are not conscious that they are actually making a decision to deny Christ in their lives. They may have hypnotized themselves into believing that they still really are practicing Christians. Scripture tells us in John 8:47: "He who is of God hears the words of God."

Have you ever asked yourself whether you are a candidate for a slow leak? Now is the time to think, pray and do something about it.

Above all, now is the time to worship God in our homes and in our church, to repent daily of our sins, to confess our Savior, and to really start serving Him. The doors of the church are open every Sunday and Saturday and ought to be entered. Are you entering them? Your Pastor,

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

May 10, 2022 - 7:00pm

- CALL TO ORDER The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Boyd Weise, Bill Klaevemann, Linda Peyton, Hope Jendrzey, Cindy Parma, Cathy Moritz, Pam Hoefling, and Kristin Schustereit. Bonnie Riedesel, Debra Niemeier, Nicholas Lee, and Katie Serrano were also in attendance.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Nicholas Lee.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from April 12, 2022, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) **REPORTS**
 - a) **Treasurer/Stewardship** Cindy Parma made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Bill Klaevemann seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - b) Parish Education No report.
 - c) Youth Linda Peyton reported:
 - **1.** Inside church: Easter 2022 program, hosted a youth committee meeting.
 - 2. Outside church: Helped at YAM (04/06).
 - d) **Family/Youth Director** Nicholas added there will be a parent meeting on May 24th at 6:30pm.
 - e) **Worship** Boyd Weise reported: He spoke with Mary Ressman, and she is willing to work with us for Poinsettia and Easter Lily orders in the future. Pastor Tim will be on vacation beginning June 13th. He will be gone for June

18th and 19th services. Beginning June 12th, there will be seasonal changes to our liturgy.

- f) Evangelism/Outreach Hope Jendrzey reported: Flowers were ordered from Goliad Flower Company for the Altar for Mother's Day services.
- g) **Social Concerns** Cathy Moritz reported: \$100 was provided to one individual for assistance with an electricity bill.
- h) **Christian Life** Pam Hoefling reported: A potluck is planned for Sunday, May 15th.
- i) **Property** Bill Klaevemann reported the following as of April 2022:
 - **1.** Insulation and ceiling installed in boiler room.
 - **2.** Handicap ramp and rails installed at entrance to the church.
 - **3.** Replaced asphalt with concrete at entrance to Educational Building.
 - **4.** Unclogged sinks and dishwasher drains in The Learning Garden.
 - 5. Obtained bids for mowing church grounds.
 - 6. Repaired automatic door closer in The Learning Garden.
 - 7. When the cement ramp was installed in front of the Educational Building, it was noticed there is only dirt below the asphalt. This means more work will need to be done when the parking lot is replaced. Bill is working on obtaining bid adjustments that will reflect this change.
- j) Cemetery Kristin Schustereit reported: Chronicle Cemetery Software company has received all of our paper records and data. The next step will be an aerial survey.
- k) **CEM** Written report was provided.
- l) Pastor
 - 1. Professional activities during April 2022 included: 16 worship services, 1 hospital visit, 8 home visits, 8 educational events, 10 church meetings and events.
 - **2.** Official acts during April 2022 included two burials and three baptisms.
- 5) OLD BUSINESS

- a) Senior Scholarships Bonnie Riedesel spoke about how senior scholarship recipients are chosen. Currently, seniors must be a confirmed member of St. Paul, complete an application, and have proof of enrollment at a college to receive the scholarship. Her committee would like to adjust the requirements, with a possibility of requiring a certain number of Sundays in attendance at St. Paul. She would also like to see the scholarship amount to be increased.
- b) Parish Ed Council Position Pam Hoefling made a motion for the Nominating Committee to fill the Parish Ed Council position. Linda Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- c) 150th Anniversary Budget Bill Klaevemann made a motion to use funds from the operating account to pay for needs for St. Paul's 150th anniversary celebration. Boyd Weise seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- d) **Update on Parking Lot** This was discussed in the Property Report section.
- 6) NEW BUSINESS
 - a) The Learning Garden Flooring Bids were presented to replace the flooring in room one and a partial repair of the flooring in room four of The Learning Garden. Bill Klaevemann made a motion for The Learning Garden to use up to \$4,000 from the CEM account to pay for floor replacement in room one and partial repair in room four using Jung Tile. Pam Hoefling seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - b) June Council Meeting Date The June council meeting has been cancelled.
 - c) Discuss Maintenance and Yard Care Bill Klaevemann made a motion for St. Paul to hire Garcia Lawn Service of Cuero to care for church grounds for \$300 per mowing. Linda Peyton seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - d) Kitchen Commercial Refrigerator Bill explained there are issues with one of the doors on the commercial refrigerator in the kitchen that cannot be properly repaired. The door is currently temporarily repaired. Bill Klaevemann made a motion to table this topic until the


next meeting. Cindy Parma seconded the motion. The motion carried.
