CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH

August 11, 2020

- 1) **CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of the Church Council of St. Paul Lutheran Church was called to order by Clem Waskow, president. Council members present for the meeting were Pastor Tim Muehlbrad, Clem Waskow, Cathy Moritz, Linda Peyton, Linda Hurta, Calvin Bruns, Nicholas Requejo, Jay Heil, Michael Melanson, Judy Taylor, and Martha Geffert. Also attending was Katie Serrano.
- 2) **DEVOTION** The devotion was given by Pastor Tim.
- 3) **MINUTES** The minutes from June 16, 2020, were approved as printed with no corrections.
- 4) **REPORTS**
 - a) **Treasurer** – Calvin Bruns reported: The balance in the General Fund as of July 31, 2020, was \$292,044.48. The balance in the Building Fund was \$13,578.47. Calvin Bruns made a motion to accept to report as written. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried.
 - b) **Stewardship** – Nothing to report.
 - c) **Parish Education** – Linda Hurta reported: Sunday School lessons are being mailed home. They are waiting to see how public school goes before reopening Sunday School again. They are looking into other options for Sunday School.
 - d) **Youth** – Nothing to report.
 - e) **Family/Youth Director** – Nicholas reported: Three high school students wrote letters of encouragement to the residents of Yorktown Manor. High School program lessons are being produced. He is continuing producing Children's Sermon videos.
 - f) **Worship** – Jay Heil reported: They are looking into different options for Saturday service, which is currently being held in the Fellowship Hall. If numbers continue to rise for this service, some changes will need to be made to accommodate everyone safely.
 - g) **Evangelism/Outreach** – Martha reported: An ad has been placed on the YISD football poster.
 - h) **Social Concerns** – Judy Taylor reported: One person was assisted with a motel room in Cuero. Two families were assisted with water bill.

- i) Christian Life** – Cathy Moritz reported: Their first event will be held August 21, 2020. It will be a movie night in the Fellowship Hall. Masks will be worn, and social distancing will be followed. They will be showing The Buttercream Gang. Snacks will begin at 6:30, and the movie will begin at 7:00. Our funeral ministry, headed up by Pam Hoefling, is going very well. So far, four families have been provided food during their time of need. Food is prepared by volunteers, left at the Fellowship Hall, and then an appointed person picks everything up and delivers to the family.
- j) Property** – Michael reported: The following items have been worked on/addressed: church bells received yearly maintenance; Organ had a blown fuse; New zero-turn mower has been ordered for the cemetery; Basement door has been repaired; Cleaning supplies vendor has been changed to a specialized cleaning sanitation product vendor; Automatic door button box has been repaired; Sprinkler heads by fellowship hall have been fixed; Trees trimmed around property; A/C is not working correctly in the infant room at TLG; Cables will be replaced for limbs on big oak tree; Crown molding has been re-glued in multiple rooms at TLG. Michael expressed sincere thanks to Pastor Tim for helping with gluing crown molding and to Bill Klaevemann for fixing the automatic door button box.
- k) Cemetery** – No report.
- l) CEM** – No report.
- m) Pastor** – Professional activities during June 2020 included: 5 worship services, 2 home visit, 4 church meetings and events, 1 community event, 1 burial, and 1 wedding. Professional activities during July 2020 included: 8 worship services, 3 home visits, 5 church meetings and events, and 3 burials. Confirmation classes will start up again on September 13, with the following guidelines in place: Classes will be in the Fellowship Hall; Masks will be required at all times; Classes will begin at 10:30 on Sunday mornings and

end at noon; No food will need to be served; One short bathroom break will be taken during that hour and a half.

5) OLD BUSINESS

a) **Stove** – Pastor explained it seems everything has finally been settled and fixed with the new stove. There has been no more smell of gas.

b) **Stained Glass Windows Repair** – Clem reported we are ready to sign the contract from Foster Stained Glass, and work should tentatively begin in October.

c) **Coronavirus**

1. **Sanitation** – No new changes at this time.

2. **Sunday Service** – No new changes at this time.

3. **Saturday Service** – If Saturday service continues to grow, service may need to be moved to the sanctuary. The sanitizing method for this is on back order as of now.

4. **Sunday School** – No new changes at this time.

5. **Youth** – No new changes at this time.

6. **Funerals** – No new changes at this time.

7. **Weddings** – No new changes at this time.

8. **Other meetings and Functions** – No new changes at this time.

9. **Fellowship Hall Rentals** – We will continue to keep rentals on hold until further notice.

10. **Church Office** – No changes were made. Office is still closed.

6) NEW BUSINESS

a) **GoToMeeting** – We have been working out kinks.

b) **Secretary Medical Leave** – Katie will be having a medical procedure done on Wednesday, September 2, 2020. She will not be released for work for two weeks. She would like to work from home, but we need a back-up plan in case things don't go as planned. Pastor explained the main concern is the recording of finances. There are limited people who would be able to do this. Linda Hurta and Cathy Moritz volunteered to help where needed.

c) **NALC San Miguel Lutheran Church** – Pastor explained San

Miguel Lutheran Church in Fort Worth was sued about three years ago by the ELCA for \$489,000. In June, they came to a settlement in which San Miguel will pay the ELCA \$80,000 (\$629.00 per month) over the next ten years to have the ELCA withdraw all claims to the congregation and property. Pastor has suggested to give \$10,000 to help. He explained we could use money from our Benevolence – Relief fund, which currently has \$29,463.32. Judy Taylor made a motion to give \$10,000.00 from the Benevolence – Relief Fund to the San Miguel Lutheran Church in Fort Worth. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried.

d) Donation to Schools - Judy Taylor explained we gave \$1,200 in 2017 and 2018 and \$1,008.28 in 2019, to help with school supplies at YISD. We agreed to go ahead and give the same amount as in the past, even though there may be more of a need for assistance from their fund due to COVID-19.

7) CLOSING Michael Melanson made a motion to adjourn. Jay Heil seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.

BABY CARE KITS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts.
- If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.
- Onesies can be cut and hemmed or serged to make a simple t-shirt.
- Gowns, rompers or top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers.
- Gently used, clean clothing and blankets (no stains or tears) may be substituted for new ones. It is especially important that the items be in excellent condition, as used clothing is increasingly difficult to get through customs in many countries. Even one item that looks worn or stained to local officials can jeopardize the status of a whole shipment. All other items (diapers, towel, soap) in the Kit must be new.
- Please include items with religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces.
- Add other items as God leads you.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH BABY CARE KIT

TWO lightweight cotton t-shirts

TWO long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers

TWO receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square

FOUR cloth diapers, flat fold preferred

ONE jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap

TWO pairs of socks

ONE hand towel, any color

TWO or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

TWO diaper pins or large safety pins

HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

- Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes. Label contents in **LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS** on the outside of the boxes.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents

In July, The Learning Garden was approached by the Victoria County United Way to host a Tiny Library. In reading more about it we decided it would be a great idea for our area. The Reading Nook will be placed in

the Educational Building Entrance by the display case. It is to be used by Congregation Members, TLG Families, and whomever else would like to use it. The reading nook is being delivered August 25, 2020.

From the United Way: Our Tiny Library program places stocked reading nooks in Crossroads daycares and other places kids gather. This initiative aims at putting books in the hands of young children and their families, and to encourage them to read together. Reading to young children is proven to improve cognitive development. Reading daily to young children, starting in infancy, can help with language acquisition and literacy skills. In fact, a recent brain scan study found that “reading at home with children from an early age was strongly correlated with brain activation in areas connected with visual imagery and understanding the meaning of language” ([TIME.com](https://www.time.com)) Studies have shown that “the more words that are in a child’s language world, the more words they will learn, and the stronger their language skills are when they reach kindergarten, the more prepared they are to be able to read, and the better they read, the more likely they will graduate from high school” ([PBS.org](https://www.pbs.org)).

We have partnered with Redbird Bookstore, Texian Books, and the Victoria Public Library to collect books with which to stock the shelves. Thanks to them and their generous customers, we have nearly 500 books to date. Citizens Hospital funded and helped build our first 8 reading nooks, and Joshua Bonorden of Victoria managed the building and fabric design as his Eagle Scout project.
